CP Kids Creative Team Members serve in our K-5 area. 4th and 5th graders have the opportunity to serve by participating on the Motions team or the Tech team. 6th grade and older have the opportunity to serve by leading our Motions Team or the Tech team.

What Is Important to Us

Christ Place Values

1. All For Christ - All that we do is to honor Jesus!

Whether we are on stage, off stage, in the tech booth, or out of the tech booth, all that we do is to honor and be glory to Jesus. We are setting an example to other believers in what we say, how we live, love, and believe. (1st Timothy 4:12)

2. Better Together - We love doing life together!

We believe in community and will strive to be disciple-makers on the CP Kids Creative Team. There are no insignificant roles. Everyone has a part to play on our team. (Romans 12:4-8)

3. Reach the Lost - We exist for those who aren't here yet!

Our CP Kids Creative Team will aim to model how it looks to follow Jesus. We will help create a welcoming atmosphere in the K-5 area and help all kids who enter K-5 feel welcome. (Mark 16:15)

STRATEGY

Roles in CP Kids

"White Shirts" 4th and 5th-grade Motions Team: These students attend rehearsal on their scheduled weekend. They have the opportunity to be on stage and accompany the "Red Shirts" in worship.

"Black Shirts" 4th - 12th grade Tech Team: When scheduled, these students have the opportunity to be in the tech booth during worship and learn the ProP, lighting system, audio, etc.

"Red Shirts" 6th grade and older Motions Team: These students attend rehearsal on their scheduled weekend. They have the opportunity to be on stage and lead worship.

Producer- Adult Tech Team: These adults attend rehearsal on their scheduled weekend and run tech during rehearsal. They are in the tech booth the entire service, running ProP, lighting system, audio, etc.

PART 2: THE PART YOU PLAY

"White Shirts" 4th and 5th grade Motions Team

These students attend rehearsal when they are scheduled. They are able to be on stage and accompany the "Red Shirts" in worship.

Team Responsibilities

- When scheduled, accept or decline your request.
- Wear your shirt when you are scheduled, or you will not be able to be on stage.
- Attend rehearsal when you are scheduled, or you will not be able to be on stage.
- Practice the songs at home by using our YouTube Playlist.
- Attend Sunday Team Time to grow in relationships with other team members, dive deeper into God's Word, and practice any new songs.
- On stage, smile, and sing. Praising Jesus is fun!
- Actively participate in your small group. Be a role model to your peers.
- Be teachable and have an attitude of service.
- No cell phones during rehearsal, before, during, or directly after service.
- Stay in the K-5 Auditorium until an adult has checked you out.
- Actively attend and participate in age-appropriate programming, attending K-5 and Midweek.
- I will remember that I am setting an example to others (1st Timothy 4:12). This means I will Be Respectful (in your actions, attitude, and speech, Be Kind (be welcoming, encouraging, and accepting of others), and Give My Best, on and off the stage and in and out of the tech booth.

Prior to Service

- Attend rehearsal when you are scheduled. Saturday rehearsal start time is 4:45 pm. Sunday rehearsal start time is 8:15 am.
- Attend CP Kids Creative Huddle directly after rehearsal.
- Attend All-Church Huddle.
- Attend K-5 Huddle

During Service

- Be an example to those around you.
- Have an attitude of service.
- Smile and sing! It's fun to praise Jesus!
- Actively participate in your group.
- No cell phones before, during or immediately following service.
- You can NOT lead a group or help lead a group.

Stay in the K-5 Auditorium until you are checked out.

What is CP Kids Creative?

CP Kids Creative is a team of students with a heart and desire to love and serve like Jesus. These students have the privilege of serving on our K-5 motions team or our K-5 Tech Team. We want students to learn the importance of serving, responsibility, working as a team, and being role models to their peers. CP Kids Creative allows students to practice these skills.

What are the expectations for CP Kids Creative?

The CP Kids Creative Team students are expected to be kind and respectful and consistently give their best. In addition, our CP Kids Creative team members are expected to be examples to those around them (1st Timothy 4:12). Below are other expectations we have for the students who participate on the CP Kids Creative Team:

-When scheduled, accept or decline your request.

- -Wear your shirt when you are scheduled, or you will not be able to be on stage.
- -Attend rehearsal when you are scheduled, or you will not be able to be on stage.
- -Attend Sunday Team Time to grow in relationships with other team members, dive deeper into God's Word, and practice any new songs.
- -If you've been assigned a small group, actively participate in your group.
- -Be teachable and have an attitude of service.
- -No cell phones during rehearsal, before, during, or directly after service.
- -Communicate with your service coach if you will be attending Edge Weekend.
- -We highly encourage you to attend Main Service, so you can see what it looks like to set the tone, have stage presence, and to hear transitions.
- -Check-in when you are serving as a Jr. Team Member.
- -Actively attend and participate in age-appropriate programming, K-5 programming or attending Edge Weekend and CP Youth.

The CP Kids Creative Team will remember they are setting an example to others (1st Timothy 4:12). This means they will:

Be Respectful (in our actions, attitude, and speech,

Be Kind (be welcoming, encouraging, and accepting of others), and

Give My Best, on and off the stage and in and out of the tech booth.

Tell me more about these Tuesday Team Time?

Tuesday Team Times will be on the 3rd Tuesday of each month during the school year. We will meet from **6:00-7:30 pm** in the K-5 Auditorium. Please enter through the North Doors. We will use our Team Time to invest in you. We will play a game, dive into God's Word, and get familiar with the responsibilities of each team. The Tech team will learn to use Pro-Presenter and understand the soundboard, computers, and lighting system. The Motions team will learn or practice motions to songs and learn about stage presence and what it means to worship. While I don't require your to be at the Team Times, I highly encourage it.
